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1 Our School

1.1 Type of School

Shau Kei Wan Government Secondary School is a co-educational grammar school operated by the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government.

1.2 Historical Background

Shau Kei Wan Government Secondary School was founded in 1961. As the school was still under construction, it operated in the shared premises of Clementi Middle School at Fortress Hill Road. It moved to its present premises at 42 Chai Wan Road, Hong Kong in the autumn of 1964 and was officially opened on 19 November 1964.

1.3 School Facilities

The school has a total of 31 classrooms, plus a Computer-Assisted Learning Room, a Multi-media Learning Centre, an English Language Room, a Liberal Studies Room, 2 E-learning Rooms, 4 laboratories (for Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Science) and 5 special rooms (for Visual Arts, Music, Design and Technology, Home Economics/Needlework and Geography). The school also has a Library, a School Hall, 2 Staffrooms, a Staff Common Room, a General Office, a Conference Room, a sick room, a printing room, a Student Activity Centre, a Life Planning Room, a Social Worker's Room, a Multi-function Room, a Guidance Room and a Music Activity Room. In addition, there are a garden, a covered playground, a courtyard, a basketball court, two basketball half-courts, a volleyball court and a mini-football pitch.

1.4 School Management

School-based management was implemented in the 90's.

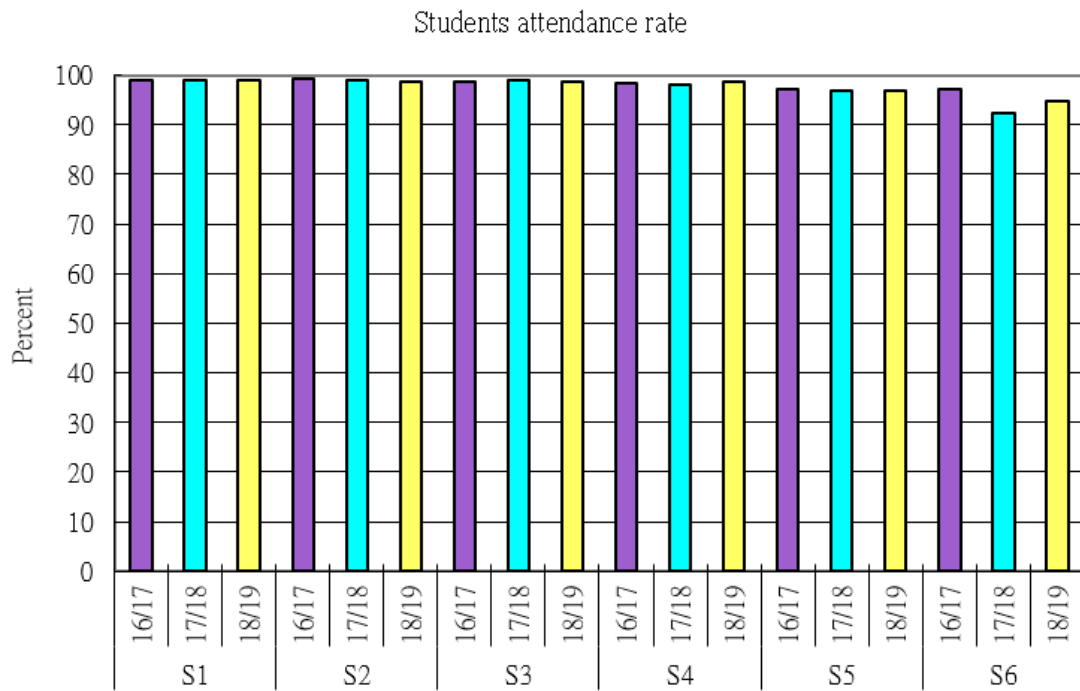

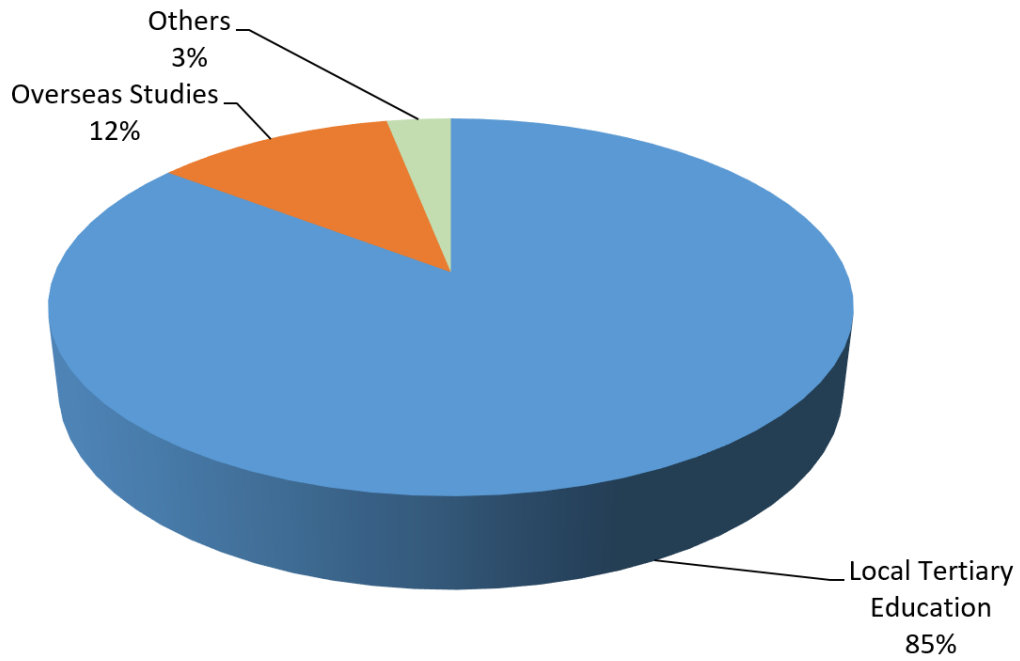

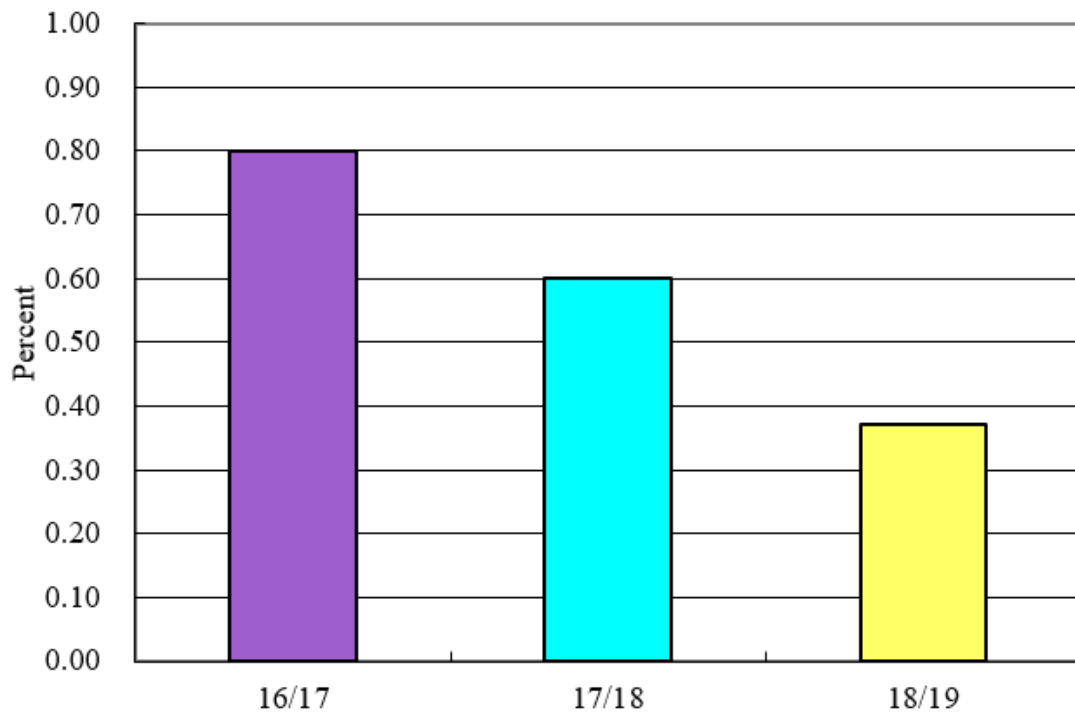


2.3 Prospects of S6 Graduates

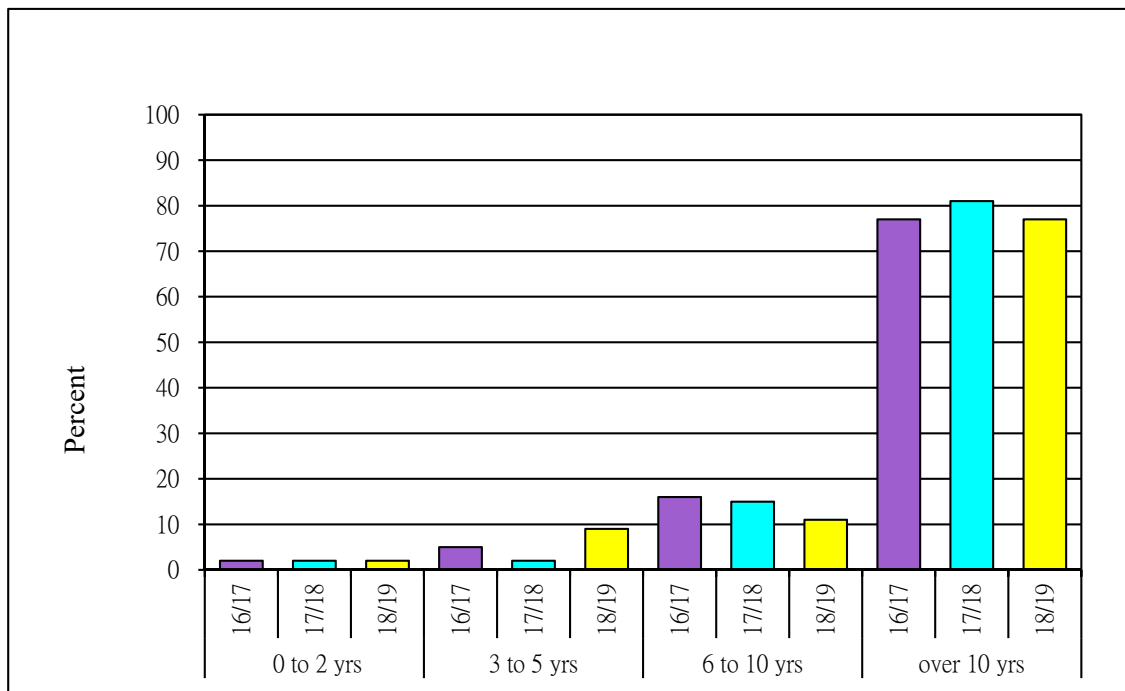

3.2 Teachers' Experience



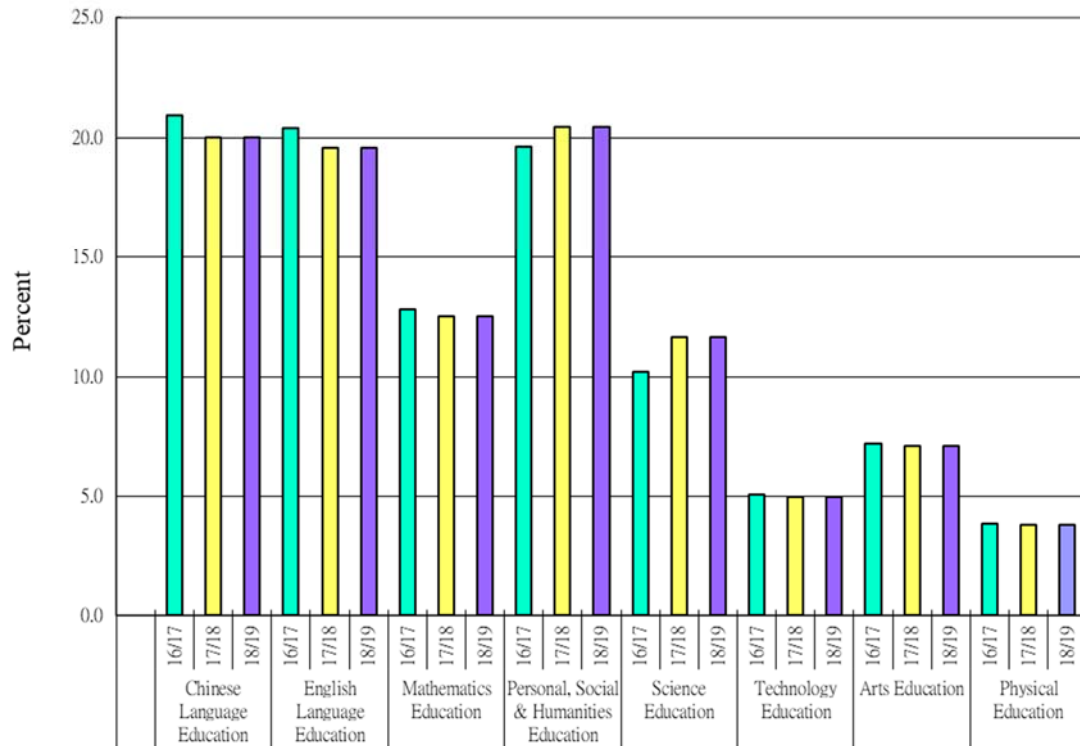

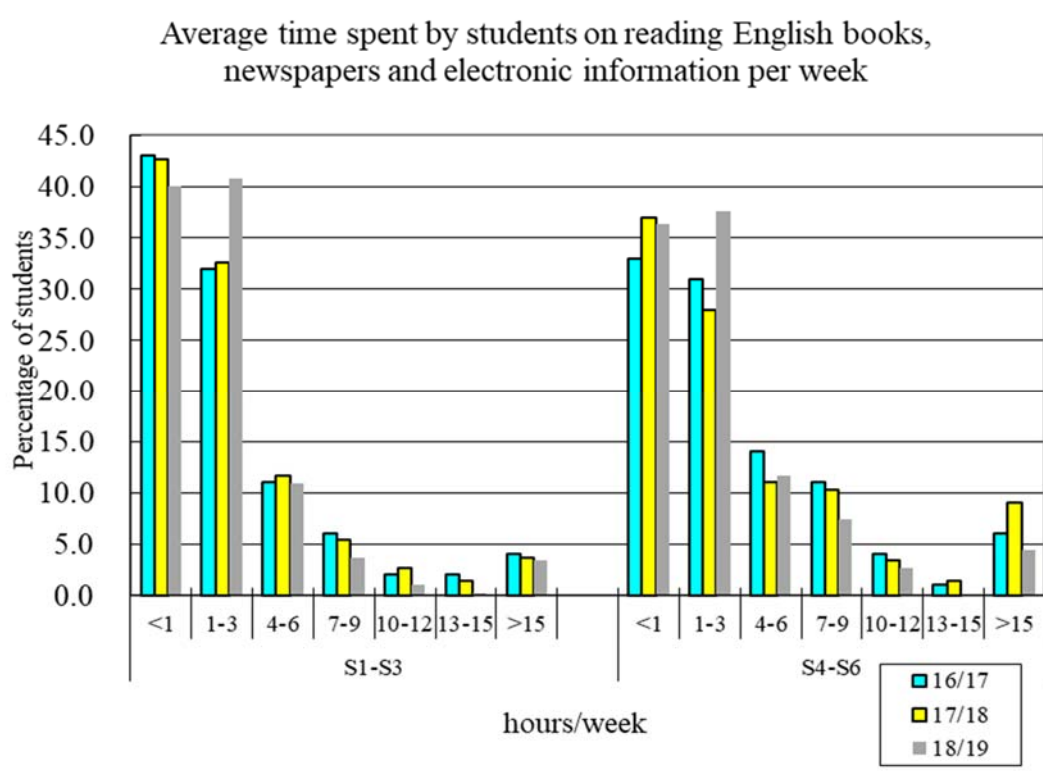
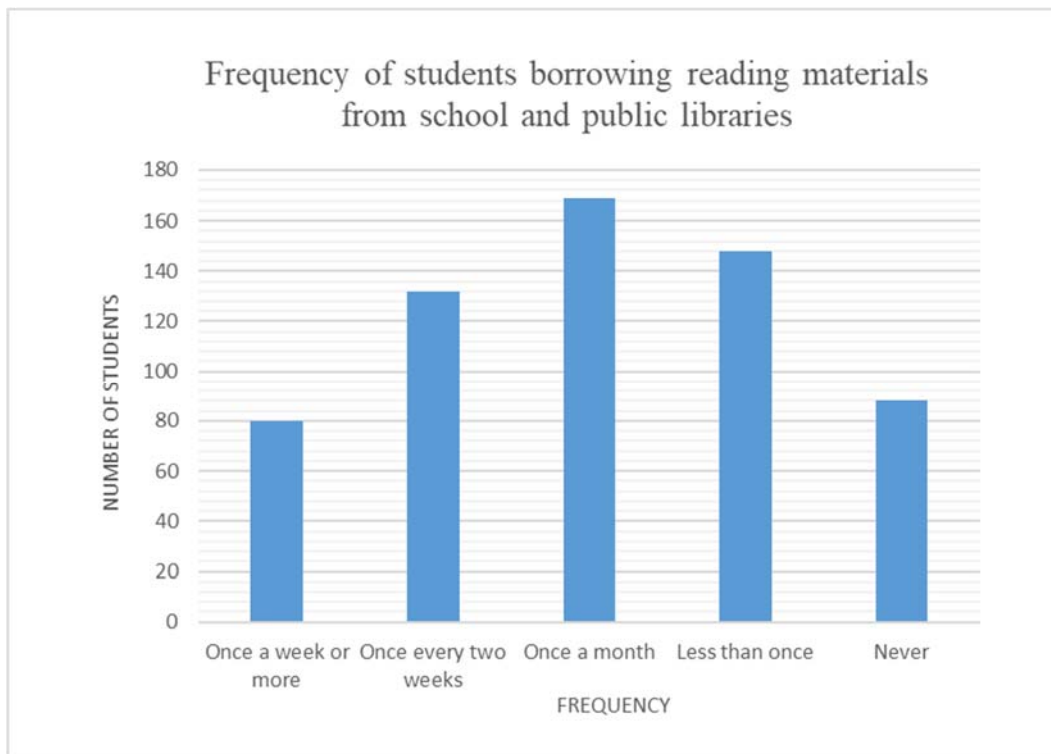
4.1 Lesson Time for the Different Key Learning Areas (KLAs) in S1-S3



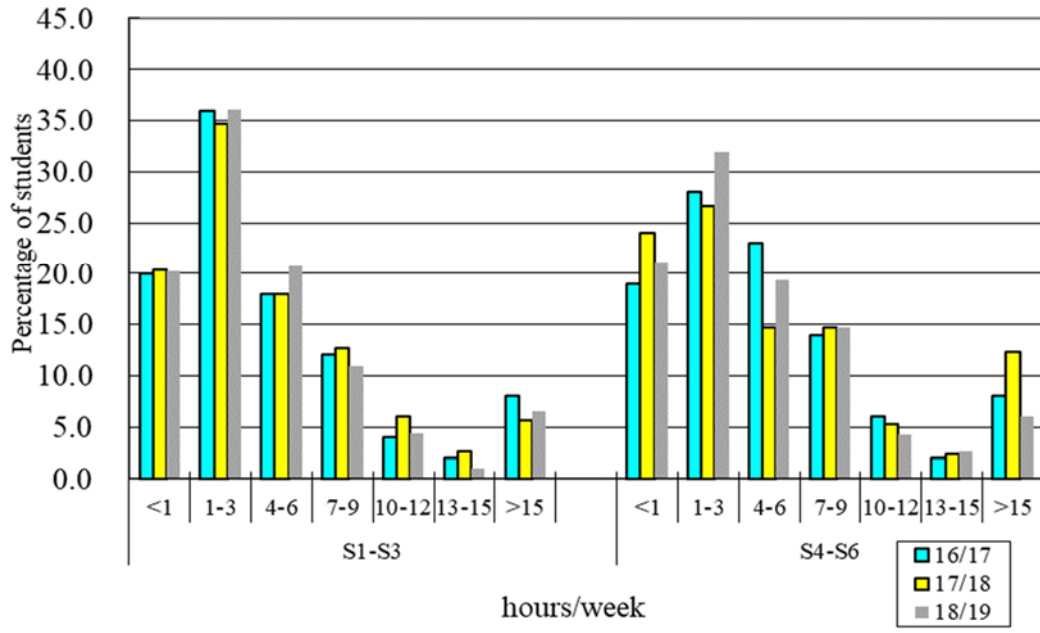
4.2 Medium of Instruction

5 Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns

5.1 Major Concern 1: To fully develop students' academic potential through self-directed learning

Focus Area A: To foster students' self-directed learning capabilities

To strengthen students' learning capabilities as self-directed learners through effective study skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To train up students with study skills which can guide students to learn independently • To motivate students to design self-generated subject-related questions • To enhance students' literacy skills in English by promoting Language across the Curriculum (LaC) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 10 departments organized workshops or training programmes on effective study skills to develop independent learning skills. e.g. "Pre-S1 Phonics Class" was given by the English Department. "DSE S6 pre-assignment on exam practices skills" was given by the Mathematics Department. "Workshop on S3 Science Project" was jointly organized by the Physics, Chemistry and Biology Departments. "S4 - Action research on ways to improve" was conducted by the Biology Department. "S3 Taster Programme" was organized by the Economics Department. "Chinese Ink Painting Workshop" was organized by the Visual Arts Department and "聯校模擬試後簡介會" was organized by the Chinese History Department. Moreover, the Liberal Studies Department trained their students with reading and summarizing skills by completing various learning tasks. The Integrated Science Department taught note-taking skills in lessons and the Physical Education Department organized volleyball and basketball training sessions for the sport teams. All the programmes helped equip students with skills to learn independently and effectively. According to the survey conducted by the Team, about 90% students agreed or strongly agreed that they were capable of applying effective study skills to learn independently. • A workshop on note-taking skills was organized by the Major Concern 1 Team for S1 students to enhance their study skills. Besides this, the majority of S1 students found that the note-taking workshop was useful and the trainers were friendly, professional and students were satisfied with their teaching. Subject teachers pointed out that students were able to make notes and organize the learned concepts. Students also applied the skills in collaborative project work. • "The S1 Note Processing Competition" was held for S1 students to apply the note-taking skills they learned to organise their subject matters. It was observed that most S1 students had acquired the note-taking skills to recall, explain, and evaluate the main concepts in their notes. • 16 departments motivated students to design subject-related questions for various learning activities. These activities included class discussion sessions, SBA discussion, pre-lesson preparation, flipped classroom tasks, speaking and writing tasks, project works, reading online articles, news discussion, music listening activities, etc. Teachers observed that peer learning was also encouraged through compiling self-generated questions. Students were able to clarify concepts together. They were also able to explore more about different topics. In 6 departments, pre-lesson preparation tasks were assigned to students. They prepared questions and brought them to the lessons. Peer learning was facilitated. • 13 departments conducted learning activities to enhance students' literacy skills in English by promoting Language across the

	<p>Curriculum (LaC). For example, the LaC project of the English Department and the IS Department launched a half-year scheme to develop the literacy skills of S1 students. The activity “Spelling Bee” was jointly organized by the English Department, the IS Department, the Geography Department and the History Department for all S1 and S2 students. Moreover, vocabulary learning tasks were assigned by the Mathematics Department for students from S1 to S3 levels. Skills of report and essay writing were taught in Physics, Chemistry and Biology lessons. LaC worksheets and assignments for vocabulary building were provided by the Biology Department, the IS Department and the Economics Department. Teachers reflected that most students showed improvement in the use of English vocabulary. They were able to use correct tenses and sentence patterns to answer questions and write their laboratory reports.</p>
<p>2. To foster self-directed learning by the extensive use of e-learning technology</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To strengthen the use of Google Suite as the learning management system (LMS) and communication tools to facilitate self-directed learning • To strengthen “Reading to Learn” by providing students with opportunities to read extensively texts of different types and themes using electronic reading devices • To enrich the library resources by introducing e-books and to promote online reading and writing reflections • To encourage students to read different types of texts and applying their knowledge in subject-related projects, IES and assignments 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 14 subject departments used Google Suite or Google Classroom for disseminating learning materials, collection of assignments and making announcements. Examples were Google Docs, Google Form, Google Slide, Google Image and Google Online Forum. Most students developed the habit of making use of Google Classroom for learning, such as storing downloaded resources for their projects and self-learning tasks. It was also generally effective for students’ lesson preparation and revision. • 75% of the subject departments provided e-reading materials for students. These included SBA and subject-related reading materials, online teaching materials, newspaper assignments and multimedia resources like videos, animations and worksheets. Teachers reflected that there were high responding rates of students to the e-learning tasks. Extended reading tasks enriched students’ knowledge in various aspects and facilitated their self-directed learning during lessons and beyond classroom. • 8 subject departments prepared their reading lists for students. The reading materials included public online resources, publishers’ resources and the eRead booklist of HKEdCity. • There were follow-up learning tasks assigned to students by respective subject departments after reading through different media. Task examples included pre-lesson preparation worksheets, online forum, projects, assignments, oral presentations, reports and inter-class competitions. It was observed that students completed the assigned tasks with satisfactory standards. They keenly participated in the activities and were able to explore more on related topics. Students were interested in reading. On average, 150 students visited the library and 21 books were borrowed on each day. • Our school joined the “e悅讀學校計劃”(eRead) of the HKEdCity and subscribed 100 English and Chinese e-books for students to read online. The e-books were added to the booklist of the existing schemes of both language subjects and students were encouraged to read online. In addition, 10 Kindle e-readers were purchased to promote online reading in the library. • In the students’ survey, more than 80% of them agreed or strongly agreed that the Google Classroom could facilitate their learning. Our school would continue to provide adequate facilities and e-learning resources for students to promote self-directed learning. On the whole, students’ ability to learn through e-learning technology was enhanced.

For instance, the English Department organized "Presentation and/or Project on Social Issues" and "Together We Serve – Human Library", and took part in "English Drama Fest" for S1 to S5 students. The Chinese Department organized "兩文三語菁英大比併" for S2 to S5 students. The Physics, Chemistry Department and the Biology Department jointly conducted "The S3 Science Project Programme". The IS Department organized "Smart Home Workshop" and "Science Festival" for S1 and S2 students. Various visits were also organized for students of S4 and S5 levels. The LS Department organized "終審法院導賞". The Geography Department, the Chinese History Department and the History Department jointly organized "敦煌、西安歷史文化及藝術探索六天之旅". Also, the Economics Department organized "南沙前海的經濟發展和粵港合探索之旅". Moreover, the Computer Department conducted a programming course and organized a visit to an IT firm for S5 students. The Visual Arts Department organized "The Chinese Ink Workshop" for S4 students. The aforesaid activities offered diverse learning opportunities to enhance students' self-directed learning competence. • 10 subject departments, namely Departments of English, Chinese, Maths, LS, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Chinese History, Computer, HE and DT nominated students to participate in various external competitions. The examples included "Secondary Schools Debating Competitions", "International Mathematical Olympiad Preliminary Selection Contest – HK 2019", "智能城市比賽", "Biology Literacy Award", "Element of the Month for IYPT-2019 (HK) Competition for HK Secondary Schools", "Secondary Schools Maths. and Science Competition 2019", "HK GreenMech Contest", "第八屆全港學生中國國情知識大賽", "Secondary Schools Bridge Demonstration Competition 2019 (by HKUST)", "Infrastructure Building Competition for Secondary Schools (by VTC)", "Underwater Robot Challenge 2019", and "Model Airship Design Competition". Teachers observed that students demonstrated good motivation and active involvement in preparation for the competitions. Various generic skills namely creativity, collaboration skills, communication skills, IT skills and problem solving skills were enhanced. • 13 subject departments organized 44 STEM activities for students of different levels in the school year. These included seminars, workshops, study visits and competitions. For instance, the Computer Department, the DT Department and the Home Economics Department jointly organized "The Technology Week" for the whole school to demonstrate VR technology, 3D food printing and underwater robot operation. The Chinese History Department organized "「創科博覽 2018」探究活動" for S3 to S5 students. The Chinese History Department, the History Department and the Geography Department jointly organized a 6-day cultural exchange tour to Xian and Dunhuang to explore the technology developments there. The Physics Department and the Biology Department invited specialists to give talks focusing on hydroponics, nuclear radiation and safety, MTR daily operation and environmental pollution in China during the LWL periods. A workshop of 1 hour 20 minutes about designing smart home lighting system was given to all S2 classes by the IS Department.

	<p>The Physics Department invited Dr. Tong Shiu-sing from the Chinese University of Hong Kong to demonstrate funny experiments to S4 and S5 science students.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 30 S.4 and S.5 students took part in a STEM tour to Huizhou in April to explore scientific and technological development in manufacturing industries of China. Each participant submitted a piece of individual reflection stating how the tour enriched their STEM knowledge and what their overall impression was on the recent development in China. Students would share their learning experience during morning assembly in the next year. In morning assemblies throughout the year, more than half of all subject departments arranged their students to share their learning experience gained in various competitions, visits, etc. Book presentations by each S1, S2 and S4 classes were also introduced in the morning assemblies in this year to promote reading among students. Teachers reflected that students enjoyed the activities and performed very well in all tasks and competitions. Nearly 90% of students also reflected that the school provided a great variety of learning activities for them and they enjoyed these activities.

Focus Area B: To optimize teachers' pedagogical skills with a view to promoting self-directed learning

Teachers reflected that students showed good response during the lessons, especially when flipped classroom content was referred to. Moreover, pre-lesson preparation enhanced students' learning effectiveness in class and their self-directed learning skills. 24 teachers from 9 subject departments attended professional courses related to self-directed learning (9 teachers), e-learning (11 teachers) and EMI / LaC (4 teachers). Most teachers agreed that the courses were useful in enhancing their teaching effectiveness.
<p>2. To sustain the intellectual capital of the school by implementing knowledge management</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To invite teachers from different subject departments to open their classrooms for lesson observation with the focus on self-directed learning To develop a resource bank and/or a school-based multi-media archive of learning programmes/activities To make use of student assessment data to analyse the performance of students and develop appropriate support measures 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 85% of the subject departments arranged lesson observation focused on self-directed learning. Teachers were able to exchange views to refine their teaching pedagogies and share their insights for future collaboration. 17 subject departments established resource banks respectively and maintained the practice of regular uploading learning/teaching materials in the school server. 14 subject departments made use of assessment data to enhance teaching and learning effectiveness. The types of assessment data used included those of predicted grades in S5 and S6, <i>DSE Examination Statistical Reports</i>, <i>TSA Results</i> and <i>Students' Scripts in the DSE examination</i>. Based on the findings, students were better informed of their expected grades and had more realistic expectations of their performance. They would know the common mistakes and areas of improvement in public examination. Moreover, students became more aware of their learning and revision progress. Supportive measures like supplementary classes and tailor-made learning resources were provided by the subject departments according to the needs of students.

Overall Remarks:

- The tasks in the programme plan were mostly achieved. The scores in the stake-holders' survey revealed that students were satisfied with their learning and slight improvements in the scores were witnessed. The ratings in the APASO survey (Independent Learning Capacity) were much higher than the territory norm. In the survey conducted by the Team, 90% of the students agreed and strongly agreed that teachers provided various learning opportunities for students to promote self-directed learning. More than 87% of students agreed and strongly agreed that they learned independently and confidently in an active manner. Building upon the present foundation, we will continue to adopt measures to promote *self-directed learning* in the coming school year.
- 32 teachers tried out flipped classroom strategies in their lessons. The school may continue to encourage teachers to attend professional training courses and seminars related to self-directed learning. Moreover, a resource bank/school-based multi-media archive of learning programmes/activities was developed and maintained in school server. It facilitated the sharing of good teaching practice and reduced teachers' workload in preparing teaching materials.

Achievements and Effectiveness

- A wide variety of programmes such as morning assemblies, talks by distinguished guests and alumni, exhibitions, Life Education Lessons and activities have been organized to strengthen values education by cultivating a positive, supportive and caring learning environment
- Teachers-in-charge and Class Teachers have found most activities inspiring and refreshing to engage students
- Results of APASO-II studies on “Attitudes to School (Quality of School Life) reviewed that:
 - Areas like “Achievement”, “Experience”, “General Satisfaction”, “Opportunity“, “Social Integration (Senior Form)” and “Teacher-Student Relationship” increase over that of last year and is higher than HK norm
 - However, “Negative Affect (Junior Form)” increase (worse) over that of last year and the value for both Junior Form and Senior Form are higher (worse) than HK norm
- We will continue our effort in promoting students’ positive and caring attitude next year, for Junior Forms in particular

6.3 Students' Achievements in Extra-curricular Activities

In designing extra-curricular activities, our school aims to extend classroom learning and foster students' balanced development in the areas of knowledge, attitudes and values, so as to help students grow and develop academically, morally, aesthetically, physically, and socially. Different types of training in leadership and team-building are provided for students to develop a sense of responsibility and a sense of belonging to enhance their interpersonal skills. Our students have received a number of prizes and awards in a broad array of external competitions. Details of the most outstanding achievements are listed as follows:

Several students were nominated for regional commendation scheme and received awards in recognition of their all-round achievements. One of the most remarkable students is FAN Xiuyu of 6D, who was awarded the 2018 HK Island Outstanding Student Award – Top Ten students of HK Island Outstanding Students (Senior Section). HUNG Ming Choi of 4B was awarded Outstanding Student Leaders Award - Secondary School Leaders. CHAN Tsz Ching of 5B and CHAN Yuk Shan of 5B were awarded The E-League 2018/19.

In the 70th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival (Chinese and English), our school won 3 Champions and 4 Second Runners-up in Solo Verse Speaking and Dramatic Duologue competitions. More than 56 Certificates of Merit and Proficiency were obtained. Our students also participated actively in debating competitions. The Chinese Debating Team participated in more than nine major inter-school competitions this year. The Team entered the semi-final in the Sing Tao Inter-School Debating Competition in which Chan Yuk-shan of 5B and Hung Ming-choi of 4B were awarded the Best Debaters; and Ng Wing-san of 4B was awarded the Best Interrogative Debater in the competition. They were also chosen to be the Best Debaters in many competitions, namely the 18th Multi-vision on Basic Law – Secondary School Debating Competition (Hong Kong Island), the Joint School Chinese Debating Competition and the Hong Kong Joint School Economic Chinese Debating Competition.

In Mathematics, Science and Technology, our students participated actively in external competitions and won plenty of awards. SIU Ka Sing of 6D was the Top 12 students of Scientist and Mathematician in The Student of the Year Awards 2018. HUNG Tsz Yuet of 2D and WU Ming Lee of 2D were the **Third Class Honour** of the Hong Kong Junior Mathematics Olympiad - National Mathematical Forum for Youths, while CHAN Wing Yiu of 3D won the Second Runner-up of Mathematical modelling Section in the same competition. SIU Ka Sing of 6D and Lau Sin Tung of 6B won the token of encouragement of their research work as their work has exceeded beyond average secondary school level in Hang Lung Mathematics Awards. In addition, our S5 students participated in the Secondary School Mathematics and Science Competition and won 3 Medals, 10 High Distinctions and 9 Distinctions in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics sessions. Our two S5 students LAU Ho Man of 5D and CHENG Kwan Lok of 5B participated in Computer Science Challenge 2019 organised by Computer Science Department of City University of Hong Kong in April 2019. They performed remarkably well and were awarded the Certificate of Excellence. Besides these, our school won the Second Runner-up in the Secondary Schools Bridge Demonstration Competition 2019, which was organized by the Civil and Environmental Engineering Students' Society of the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. The team members were NG Wang-hin of 4A, LAI Chun-ching of 4B, Lam chak-yu of 4B, NG Chun-ki of 4B, NG

Maggie of 4B, NG Wing-san of 4B and YUEN Ho of 4D. In addition, LIU Kangni of 2B, SO Cheuk-long of 3C, LEE Yuen-chung of 3D, LI Chi-kin of 3D and NG John Thomas Batong of 3D won the Best Engineering Award and Best Joint School Inclusion Award in the Underwater Robot Competition 2019 organized by Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. In the Model Airship Design competition organized in July 2018, our school obtained seven prizes in total. LUK Yin-hoi of 2D, SZE Kin-shing of 2D and TANG Shun-him, Samuel, of 2D won the 1st Runner-up in the Programming Stream. NG Wang-hin of 4A, NG Chun-ki of 4B and NG Wing-san of 4B won the 2nd Runner-up in the Obstacle Race Stream; and LAU Ming-kit of 5D and HUANG Ho-yin, Eric, of 6D won the 2nd Runner-up in the Speed Race Stream.

In Geography, MOK Kai-chit of 6D won the Champion in the 9th Hong Kong Geography Olympiad, organized by the Hong Kong Geographical Association. In addition, a group of Geography students, namely CHU Sing-yiu Samuel of 5D, TSOI Ka-lam of 5D and YANG Ka-yi of 5B took part in the Young Ambassador for Geoconservation Training Programme co-organized by the NWS Holdings Limited and the Association for Geoconservation, Hong Kong. Their outstanding performance in the training sessions were appreciated and they were granted a field-trip in Wenzhou out of the 100 teams in Hong Kong for winning the Most Proactive Participation Team Award.

In Music, our students won the Bronze Award in the Chinese Orchestra Contest (Secondary School Class A) and the Merit Award in the Symphony Orchestra Contest (Secondary School Class B) in the 2018 Hong Kong Youth Music Interflows. Both school orchestras and the school choir performed regularly at major school functions including the Speech Day and Variety Show. A number of students also attained outstanding results in different music competitions. In the 71st Hong Kong Schools Music Festival, WONG Pui-hei of 1A was the Champion in Dizi Solo (Junior), KUNG Man-kit of 2D the Champion in Sheng Solo (Junior), TO King-hei of 2D the Champion in Violin Solo (Grade Six), CHIU Yuk of 1D the First Runner-up in Violin Duet (Junior) as well as the Second Runner-up in Viola Solo (Junior) and CHEUNG Yuen-lee of 5E the Second Runner-up in Liuqin Solo (Advanced). In addition, LEUNG Ka-chun of 5D was named the Arts Ambassador-in-school by the Hong Kong Arts Development Council. He was also the Chairperson of the Symphonic Orchestra and helped coordinate the music performances at various school functions.

In Visual Arts, CHIU Man-hei of 4B was named the Arts Ambassador-in-school by the Hong Kong Arts Development Council for her active participation in promoting visual arts.

In the Hong Kong School Drama Festival 2018/19, our school won the Award for Commendable Overall Performance, Award for Outstanding Stage Effect and Award for Outstanding Cooperation. LO Cheuk-kei Peony of 5B and WU Ka-chai of 5E won the Award for Outstanding Director. Also NG Kwan Lap Kenneth of 2D, CHU Ching Hang of 4B, CHAN Tsz Ching of 5B, KWONG Ka Lok of 5B, LO Cheuk Kei Peony of 5B, YIU Man Ching of 5B, CHANG Kai Hing of 5C, WONG Mei Ki of 5D and CHENG Tsz Ching of 5E won the Award for Outstanding Performer.

In uniform Teams, Hong Kong Red Cross Youth Unit 27 won the Champion and Best Inspection Team Award in the Hong Kong Red Cross Youth and Volunteer Department Hong Kong Island Division Drilling Competition (Open Category) 2018-2019. YUEN Man-hin of 2A, LEUNG Wai-yin of 4A and YIP King-man of 4A won the Best Flag Party Award. CHU Ching-hang of 4B won the Best Commander Award in the same competition. We also won the Champions of the Hong Kong Red Cross Youth and Volunteer Department Hong Kong Island Division Eastern District (II) Youth First Aid Competition 2018-2019 and

Hong Kong Red Cross Youth and Volunteer Department Hong Kong Island Division Eastern District (II) Youth Nursing Competition 2018-2019. LAM Wing-yan of 5C won the Best Leader of the Hong Kong Red Cross Youth and Volunteer Department Hong Kong Island Division Eastern District (II) Youth First Aid Competition 2018-2019. Our Red Cross Youth Unit also won the second runner-up of Hong Kong Red Cross Youth and Volunteer Department Hong Kong Island Division Youth First Aid Competition 2018-2019. In addition, members of our Hong Kong Air Cadet Corps, CHAI Nok Ming of 5D and CHENG Kwai Yu of 3D successfully completed the Operation Kingbird 2018 and the Government Flying Service Aviation Inspiration Programme respectively. On top of these, our Boy Scouts were the Champions in the 22nd Island Scout Trail Walk 2019 (Member group 50 km and scout group 25 km). We were also the Champion in the qualification match in Shau Kei Wan District for the Carlton Trophy Competition 2019. In addition, we won the First Runners-up in the Hong Kong Island Region Footdrill Competition 2018 (Selection group).

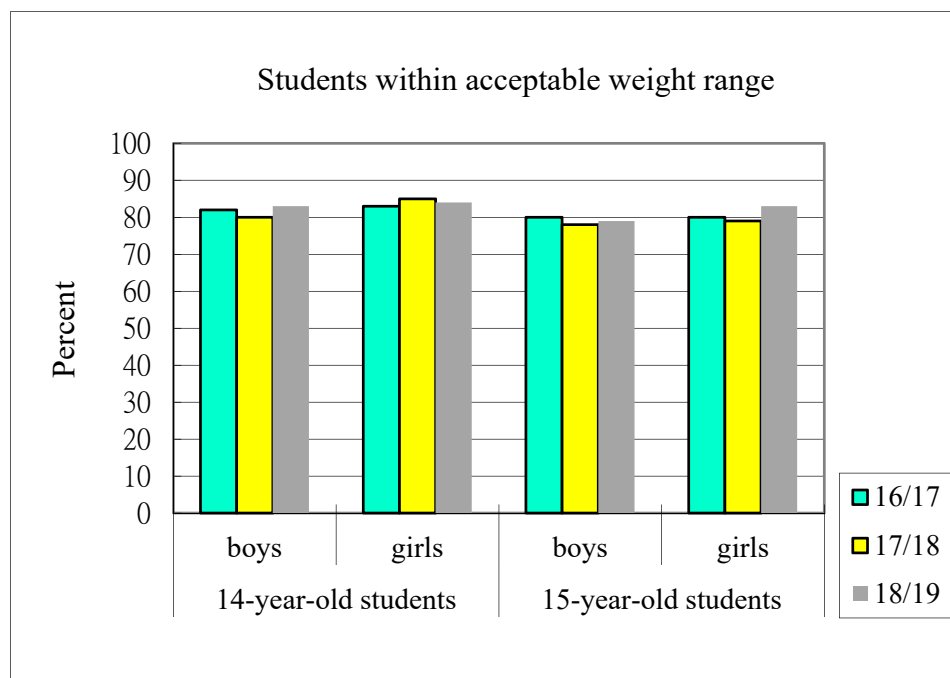
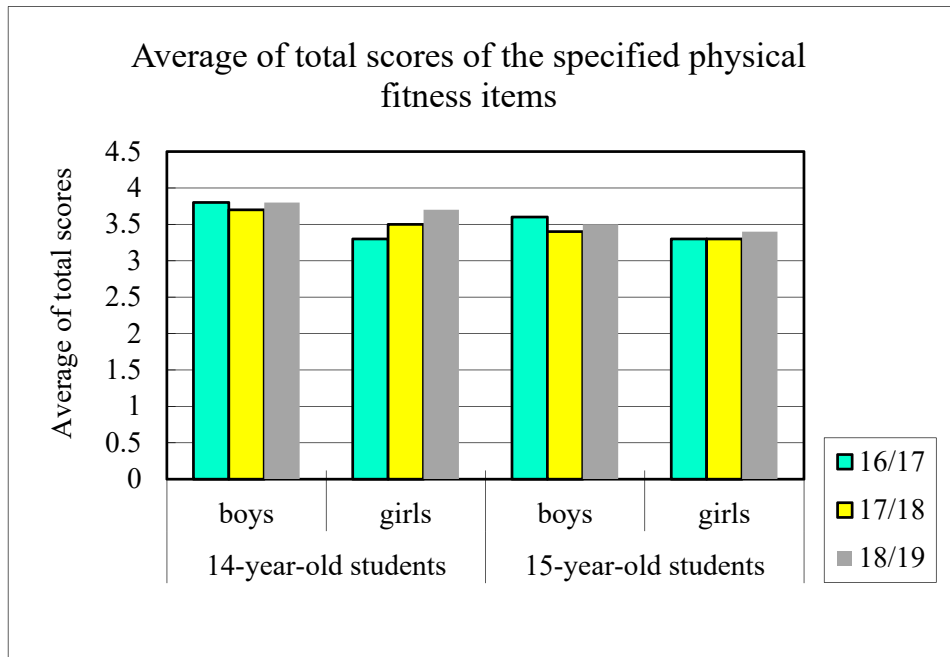

In the Inter-school Athletics Meet (Division III Area 3), WONG Wing Yee of 4D won the 3rd Runner up in Girls B Grade 100m Hurdle, YEUNG Wun Ki Sheilla of 2A won the 2nd Runner up in Girls C Grade 200m and LI Hoi Ming of 3C won the champion in Boys B Grade Javelin Throw. In the Inter-school Table-tennis Competition (Division III), we won the Champion in Girls C Grade. In Inter-school BOCHK Beach Volleyball Cup 2018-2019 (Division II), our Beach Volleyball Team won the 2nd Runner-up in Girls A Grade. In the Inter-School Volleyball Competition (Division I), our school won the 3rd Runner- up in Boys A Grade and Boys B Grade, the 1st Runner-up in Girls B and the 3rd Runner-up in Girls Overall. In external sports competitions, our volleyball team won the 1st Runner-up in CYT Volleyball Cup 2018 (Boys Secondary), which was organized by Shun Tak Fraternal Association Cheng Yu Tung Secondary School. Our girls won the Champion in 42nd Youth Cup Volleyball (Girls Senior). In addition, LEE Yin Chun of 6E was selected to represent Hong Kong in the 19th Asian Men's U20 Volleyball Competition 2018-2019. WONG Tsz Ho of 5C was selected to represent Hong Kong in the 2nd Youth National Games. He was selected to participate in the Hong Kong Youth Volleyball Training Exchange Programme 2019; and represented Hong Kong in the School's Interport Volleyball Competition 2018-2019. Fan Ka Tung of 4C was selected to participate in the Hong Kong Youth Volleyball Training Exchange Programme 2019. Ho Wing Yan of 5E was selected to represent in the 2nd Youth National Games-Volleyball Preliminary Round. Besides, Pat Cheuk-wai of 5C won the 2nd Runner-up in the 36th Southern District Archery Competition (Boys Recurve Bow Elementary Level) and obtained the 5th place in the Hong Kong Youth Outdoor Target Archery Open Competition.

In Moral and Civic Education, Lee Ka Keung of 5D was awarded the Certificate of Merit in 「有問有答《基本法》問答比賽」 organized by Hong Kong Economic Times.

We are dedicated to enriching students' whole-personal development beyond classroom. An Adventure Training Camp was organised for all Secondary One students in Sept 2018. A Community Service Programme was compulsory for Secondary Three and Secondary Four students. A Leadership Training workshop was arranged for the officials of OLE Clubs. During the Post-exam Activity Periods, the Hong Kong Rehabilitation Power, the Hong Kong Organ Transplant Foundation, Hong Kong Island School Heads Association Honorary Members' Group and etc. were invited to give talks and to arrange film show to broaden students' horizons.

6.4 Students' Physical Development

Average of totals scores of students on specified fitness items such as body height, body weight, skinfold Measurements, Bent-knee Sit-ups, Sit-and-reach, Endurance Run / Walk, Push-ups (for boys), Bent-knee Push-ups (for girls), etc.

7.2 Discipline Team

The Discipline Team aims at developing students' self-discipline and enhancing their sense of belonging to the school. The Discipline Team will continue to team up with the subject teachers, class teachers, the Guidance Team, the school social workers and the parents to look after the administration, operation and support of the school discipline, motivate students to be mature and respectful individuals, and help students aptly conduct themselves in the society.

9 Feedback on Future Planning

9.1 **Major Concern 1: To fully develop students' academic potential through self-directed learning**

9.1.1 The tasks in the programme plan were mostly achieved. According to the student survey, over 87% of the students agreed and strongly agreed that they learned independently in an active manner.

9.1.2 Various learning opportunities were provided by different subject departments. As reflected by teachers, most students gave positive feedback and showed initiative in participating in learning activities. They enhanced their self-study skills through student-centered learning strategies and e-learning activities. Building upon the present foundation, more e-resources should be provided by the school to promote self-directed learning and e-reading. Teachers should be encouraged to attend professional training courses related to self-directed learning, e-learning or Language across the Curriculum (LaC). More sharing sessions across departments and key learning areas on pedagogical skills and professional growth should also be arranged to enrich teachers' exposure and experience in learning and teaching.

9.2 **Major Concern 2: To promote the formation of positive attitude and values among students towards life**

9.2.1 In the first year of implementation of a three-year school development cycle, the measures in the programme plan were smoothly implemented. Thanks to the support from different functional teams, subject departments, the alumni, community sources and organisations, a wide variety of programmes were organised, in the whole school approach, to help students develop positive values towards personal development and a sense of positivity in serving others. In particular, the Life Education Lessons, the programmes organised in the Life-wide Learning Sessions and the Exchange Programmes and Study Tours provided students ample opportunities to enrich their life experiences and equip themselves with the essential skills required for their healthy personal development and success in future.

9.2.2 The programme team would continue their effort to design and organise learning activities to cater for the needs of our students, particularly in the areas of students' development in caring, respect and support for others.
